PROF. FR HANS ZOLLNER S.J. is one of the leading experts on matters of safeguarding of minors and prevention of sexual abuse in the Catholic Church. Academic Vice-Rector, Dean of the Institute of Psychology and President of the Centre for Child Protection of the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome. He is member of the Pontifical Commission for the Protection of Minors and was appointed Consultor of the Congregation for the Clergy in April 2017 by Pope Francis.

Milan Bijelic is a Processwork psychotherapist and group facilitator. His is of mixed ethnicity, Croat and Serb. His personal history is linked with the collective history of the Balkan region. He has an interest in and works with trauma at both the collective and individual level. He works as a psychotherapist in the UK and in Croatia and is involved in a post-genocide reconciliation project in Rwanda.

Lea Misan is a student of Process Oriented Psychology and a lawyer by first training. Lea is the founder of the charity Act for Change which works with young people and their families affected by trauma. She facilitates women, families and community interactions, particularly around issues of coercive control, domestic violence and child abuse. She has also set up the Deep Democracy Forum which facilitates conversations in the public space.

OLUWAFEMI HUGHES

Femi is a Brighton-based poet, writer and sometime storyteller. Born of a Nigerian Father and Indian mother, she was brought up in Scotland. Turbulent years left their scars and helped Oluwafemi gain invaluable insight. Writing helps Femi to reclaim and honour what was unheard and has also developed a wider perspective of various sides of the issues.

For 30 years Oluwafemi worked as Diversity and Conflict Resolution Facilitator and a Counsellor. Femi writes compassionately about the experience of abuse within institutions of care and brings a much needed and often missing relatedness between all parts within an institutional system.

Refreshments throughout the day, but not lunch. Please bring a packed lunch.

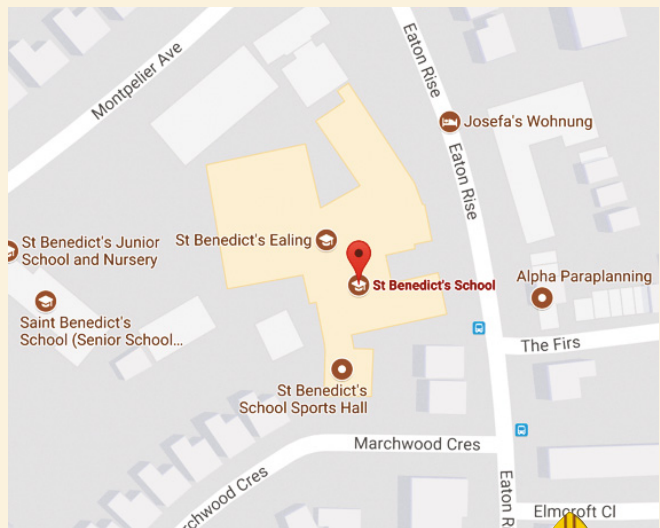
