It provides funding for protective security measures to places of worship and associated faith community centres that are vulnerable to hate crime. Will consider bids from places of worship and associated faith community centres in England and Wales. Applicants can submit bids for up to 3 protective security measures. A ‘hate crime’ can be defined as any crime that is motivated by hostility on the grounds of race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or transgender identity - for this scheme, we are focusing on religion. As part of your application, you need to provide evidence of vulnerability to hate crime that targets people because of their religion.	Link to fund
Independent Age Grants	£5,000—£15,000	Round 3 Opens 27th July Closes 9am 21st August Round 4 Opens 24th August Closes 9am 18th September	A £2m pot from Independent Age’s funds to help smaller organisations across the UK working with older people hardest hit by the virus. Aim to support work mainly focusing on: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Older people living in particularly complex and challenging situations e.g. have no family or friends or community to call on, have a disability/long-term health condition, are a carer, or other circumstances that make it hard to manage at this time. • Older people in danger of being out of sight and out of mind e.g. very isolated, neglected or very poor community, are facing stigma/discrimination, are homeless, in an abusive relationship.
