The **Under 16 Cancer Patient Experience Survey** helps NHS England to understand and improve children's cancer and tumour care in England. We need help from children who have used NHS cancer and tumour services, and their parents/carers, to test the survey with us . The survey is run by NHS England and delivered by Picker, a health and social care research charity.

What's involved?

- We will be conducting interviews between October and January to test the survey. These will be to talk about your child's cancer or tumour care, and will be conducted over the telephone or via video call on your computer, phone or tablet device. There is also a possibility that some interviews can be done in person. We will ask you which method you would prefer.
- · The interview would last no more than one hour.
- Your input will ensure the survey is suitable for understanding and improving children's cancer care.

You can volunteer if:

- You are aged 8 to 16 and have received cancer or tumour treatment or care in the last 2 years.
- You are a parent or carer of a child aged 8 to 16 who has received cancer or tumour treatment or care in the last 2 years.

If you agree to take part, we will schedule a convenient time to go over the questionnaire with you and/or your child.
